#### PUMPKIN PATCH 2020 WRAP-UP

As promised, we wanted to update all on the Pumpkin Patch 2020. In a nutshell, we had an amazing, unanticipated, wonderfully blessed year. We started out not sure we would have the sale. Pumpkins were delayed and we were setting a deadline New Mexico wasn't assuring us they could meet. We ended up realizing we don't need extra weeks of sales, just some good solid ones. Lake Ronkonkoma UMC is blessed with a community who waited - who wanted to wait. The appreciation and patience expressed from the community was a welcome sentiment.

We exceeded the sales for 2020 vs 2019 by \$58.58 and were blessed to send a check to the folks in New Mexico for \$11,136.23 while earning \$5,559.77, as well as an additional \$190 in straight donation for the church. All this in 2 ½ weeks – almost ½ the normal selling season. This will influence our sales timeframe for next year.

We added two new members to the Pumpkin Posse and officially welcomed another cause he was just always there already  $\odot$ . Ray Becht is officially a Posse member and we gave a warm welcome to Tina Filiberto and Soon Bowes as our newest members.

We'd like to share the letter below that we received from the folks in New Mexico. This little leap of faith served and it served well.

Finally, we finished the season with a Zoom meeting for all volunteers and gathered a good amount of ways to make the season even better i.e. better contact messaging, second chances box for "turning" pumpkins that still offer seeds, selfie station, increased signage for various needs, etc., etc.




