In December 1924, a new parsonage was built and dedicated next to our "Little Brown Church" on land donated by Mrs. Alice Ruland. The newly completed building was covered in brown shingles like the church next door. To celebrate the event, members of the congregation were invited to an open house . Sixty people attended the event hosted by its first occupant, the Rev. Elbert C. Hoag. The building served as our pastor's residence until 1975 when a more private home was purchased for use as our parsonage. On November 23, 1976, our Thrift Shop opened in the former parsonage, and continues to use the building to this day.

Rose wrote in The Good News, "I visualized the Christmas Tree in our sanctuary shouting the message of Christ, the Bible and the Church to everyone! The Holy Spirit was very evidently at work here". Each year since then, the Chrismon Tree in our sanctuary has been a source of beauty and inspiration.


