


#### DRIVER SAFETY WORKSHOP TO BE OFFERED

#### The Law of the Garbage Truck



How often do you let other people's nonsense change your mood? Do you let a bad driver, rude waiter, curt boss, or an insensitive employee ruin your day? Unless you're the Terminator, you're probably set back on your heels. However, the mark of your success is how quickly you can refocus on what's important in your life.

Sixteen years ago I learned this lesson. And I learned it in the back of a New York City taxi cab. Here's what happened.

I hopped in a taxi, and we took off for Grand Central Station. We were driving in the right lane when all of a sudden, a black car jumped out of a parking space right in front of us. My taxi driver slammed on his brakes, the car skidded, the tires squealed, and at the very last moment our car stopped just one inch from the other car's back-end.

I couldn't believe it. But then I couldn't believe what happened next. The driver of the other car, the guy who almost caused a big accident, whipped his head around and he started yelling bad words at us. How do I know? Ask any New Yorker, some words in New York come with a special face. And he even threw in a one finger salute! I couldn't believe it!

But then here's what really blew me away. My taxi driver just smiled and waved at the guy. And, I mean, he was friendly. So, I said, "Why did you just do that!? This guy could have killed us!" And this is when my taxi driver told me what I now call, "The Law of the Garbage Truck®." He said:

"Many people are like garbage trucks. They run around full of garbage, full of frustration, full of anger, and full of disappointment. As their garbage piles up, they look for a place to dump it. And if you let them, they'll dump it on you. So when someone wants to dump on you, don't take it personally. Just smile, wave, wish them well, and move on. Believe me. You'll be happier."

So I started thinking, how often do I let Garbage Trucks run right over me? And how often do I take their garbage and spread it to other people at work, at home, or on the street? It was then that I said, "I don't want their garbage and I'm not going to spread it anymore."

I began to see Garbage Trucks. Like in the movie "The Sixth Sense," the little boy said, "I see Dead People." Well now "I see Garbage Trucks." I see the load they're carrying. I see them coming to dump it. And like my taxi driver, I don't take it personally; I just smile, wave, wish them well, and I move on.

One of my favorite football players of all time was Walter Payton. Every day on the football field, after being tackled, he would jump up as quickly as he hit the ground. He never dwelled on a hit. Payton was ready to make the next play his best. Over the years the best players from around the world in every sport have played this way: Muhammad Ali, Nadia Comaneci, Bjorn Borg, Chris Evert, Michael Jordan, Jackie Robinson, and Pele are just some of those players. And the most inspiring leaders have lived this way: Nelson Mandela, Mother Theresa, Gandhi, and Martin Luther King.

See, Roy Baumeister, a psychology researcher from Florida State University, found in his extensive research that you remember bad things more often than good things in your life. You store the bad memories more easily, and you recall them more frequently.

So the odds are against you when a Garbage Truck comes your way. But when you follow The Law of the Garbage Truck®, you take back control of your life. You make room for the good by letting go of the bad.

The best leaders know that they have to be ready for their next meeting. The best sales people know that they have to be ready for their next client. And the best parents know that they have to be ready to greet their children with hugs and kisses, no matter how many garbage trucks they might have faced that day. All of us know that we have to be fully present, and at our best for the people we care about.

The bottom line is that successful people do not let Garbage Trucks take over their lives.

What about you? What would happen in your life, starting today, if you let more garbage trucks pass you by?

Here's my bet: You'll be happier.

"Winterfest Dinner" - January 17, 2015









#### Following are some of the delicious recipes served at "Winterfest".

This recipe is shared by Rosemarie Heiserer.

#### Rosemarie's Shrimp and Corn Bisque

#### Ingredients

½ stick of butter
1/4 cup of flour
1 medium onion chopped
2 cups of chicken broth
1 10 ounce package of frozen corn kernels
1 lb. Of red-skinned potatoes, peeled cooked and cubed
2 cups of cream, or 2 cans evaporated milk
1 tablespoon of dried parsley
1 teaspoon of salt
½ teaspoon black pepper
1 pound raw, peeled shrimp (30-35)

optional: cayenne pepper to taste

#### Recipe:

Melt butter in a soup pot and make a roux by gradually adding the flour and stirring over medium-low heat until flour and butter are blended evenly. Add onion and cook until tender and translucent, but not brown. Gradually add broth. Stir in corn, potatoes, milk and seasoning. Cook 15 minutes on medium, stirring the whole time. Add shrimp. Cook on low-medium until shrimp turn pink and float (about 5 to 8 minutes). Serves 4.

#### Cook's Illustrated Pork Shoulder

Add more water to the roasting pan as necessary during the last hours of cooking to prevent the fond from burning.

Serves 8 to 12

#### Pork Roast

- 1 bone-in pork butt, 6 to 8 pounds (see note)
- 1/3 cup kosher salt
- 1/3 cup packed light brown sugar
- · Ground black pepper

#### Peach Sauce

- 10 ounces frozen peaches, cut into 1-inch chunks (about 2 cups)
- 2 cups dry white wine
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 1/4 cup plus 1 tablespoon unseasoned rice vinegar
- 2 sprigs fresh thyme
- 1 tablespoon whole grain mustard
- 1. For the roast: Using sharp knife, cut slits in fat cap of roast, spaced 1-inch apart, in crosshatch pattern, being careful not to cut into meat. Combine salt and sugar in medium bowl. Rub salt mixture over entire pork shoulder and into slits. Wrap roast tightly in double layer of plastic wrap, place on rimmed baking sheet, and refrigerate for at least 12 hours and up to 24 hours.
- One hour before cooking, unwrap roast and brush off any excess salt mixture from surface. Season with black pepper to taste. Transfer roast to V-rack coated with nonstick cooking spray set in large roasting pan and let stand at room temperature for 1 hour. Add 1 quart water to roasting pan. Meanwhile, adjust rack to lowest position and heat oven to 325 degrees.
- 3. Cook roast, basting twice during cooking, until meat is extremely tender and instantread thermometer inserted into roast near, but not touching, bone registers 190
  degrees, 5 to 6 hours. (Check pan periodically during last two hours, if pan becomes
  dry add up to 2 cups water.) Transfer roast to carving board and let rest, loosely
  tented with foil, for 1 hour. Transfer liquid in roasting pan to fat separator and let
  stand for 5 minutes. Pour off 1/4 cup jus and discard any remaining jus and fat.
- 4. For the sauce: Bring peaches, wine, sugar, 1/4 cup vinegar, 1/4 cup defatted jus, and thyme to simmer in small saucepan; cook, stirring occasionally, until reduced to 2 cups, about 30 minutes. Stir in remaining tablespoon vinegar and mustard. Remove thyme sprigs, cover, and keep warm.
- 5. Using sharp paring knife, cut around inverted T-shaped bone until it can be pulled free from roast. (Use a clean kitchen towel to grasp bone.) Using serrated knife, slice roast. Serve passing sauce separately.


