



# History Comes Alive At The

**United Methodist Church of Lake Ronkonkoma** 



JOHN FRANCIS DUINKERKE

1885-1888 & 1903-1904

THE 18<sup>TH</sup> PASTOR TO SERVE OUR CHURCH. REVEREND DUINKERKE WAS BORN ON NOVEMBER 11, 1851 IN NEW YORK CITY. HE GRADUATED FROM PUBLIC SCHOOL AND BECAME A TRUSTED BOOKKEEPER. HE WAS LICENCED TO PREACH ON SEPTEMBER 7, 1875. HE WAS GRADUATED FROM WESLEYAN UNIVERSITY IN CONNECTICUT IN 1883. PASTOR DUINKERKE WAS ASSIGNED TO THE METHODIST EPISCOPAL CHURCH OF LAKE RONKONKOMA IN 1885. HE WAS THE FIRST PASTOR TO BEGIN REGULAR MEETINGS OF THE LEADERS AND STEWARDS OF OUR CHURCH WHICH TODAY IS KNOWN AS OUR CHURCH COUNCIL. IN 1888 OUR PASTOR WAS REASSIGNED TO CONNECTICUT BUT RETURNED TO RONKONKOMA IN APRIL 1903 WITH HIS WIFE MARY IDA (OAKLEY) AND TWO SONS JOHN JUNIOR AND THOMAS. IN 1904 THE DUINKERKE FAMILY WAS REASSIGNED TO LONG ISLAND CITY. AFTER 39 YEARS OF SERVICE REVEREND DUINKERKE RETIRED TO FARMINGDALE WHERE HE PASSED AWAY ON JANUARY 13, 1932.
