

Dear Friends at UMCLR,

February is a month when we focus on the heart. It is American Heart Month, when we raise awareness of a heart healthy lifestyle that supports our physical heart, including getting exercise, adequate rest and eating healthy. It is also the month of St. Valentine's Day so we see a lot of heart decorations around us and may have to resist the temptation to overindulge in chocolate.

What if we think of February as "God's Heart Month?" The month when we focus on God's heart of love for us and how we can respond with love for God? "For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son that whosoever believeth on him should not perish but have everlasting life." (John 3:16) God's love in Christ provides a model for the love we share with the world, love that includes, shows compassion, is forgiving, is kind, is healing and transformational.

St. Valentine is an example of someone who bravely showed love for others. During a time when new marriages became illegal in Rome because Emperor Claudius thought it would deter his efforts to recruit soldiers and distract existing soldiers from their job, Valentine, a priest, performed weddings in defiance of this ruling. He even paid for this decision with his life, and after he was executed he was buried on February 14. It is for this reason that he is often associated with romantic love today; he literally died to perform marriages during a time when they were illegal in Rome. But our Valentine's Day traditions extend beyond the romantic and it is common for friends and family members to give Valentine cards, gifts, and chocolates to one another.

Love comes in many forms, and Paul wrote in his First Letter to the Church at Corinth that it is the greatest of the spiritual gifts. The mark of a Christian is love, and so is the mark of a true church. Love "holds no record of wrongs," (1 Corinthians 13: 5). It is all about building up the other and not oneself. It is about wanting the best for others. God's love is the source of our human love, and so we give God thanks and praise when love abounds. Healthy love does not seek to control but to cooperatively work for the good of all. Healthy love is not possessive or self-centered; healthy love is generous. Healthy love values relationship over power and wealth.

There is a beautiful story that Valentine, while in jail, developed a friendship with a young blind girl named Julia, who was the daughter of the jailer. He taught her and encouraged her and helped her heal from bullying she had received. When he was sentenced to die, he wrote her a last note encouraging her to stay close to Christ and signed it "From your Valentine." This is the spiritual source of the tradition of writing notes of love on Valentine's day.

As a congregation, may we observe "God's Heart Month" and share love in Christ with one another. May we continue to embody a "healthy body of Christ, making disciples for the transformation of the world." (excerpt from New York Conference Mission statement.)



The "Sacred" Pretzel



he pretzel's legendary origins date back over 1,400 years. It was around 610 AD when legend says that a monk who lived in a monastery in Northern Italy or Southern France handed out baked pieces of leftover bread twisted together to resemble crossed arms, which was at that time a traditional prayer pose. The monk called them pretiola, which is Latin for "little rewards." He also claimed that the three-holed pretiola represented the Holy Trinity of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. During the Middle Ages, monks gave away pretzels to the poor as a religious symbol that additionally provided sustenance. Because of this, the pretzel caught on as a sign of fulfillment, good fortune and prosperity. Pretzels are also associated with Lent, as they do not contain eggs or dairy and are thus ideal for fasting.





The winter season is upon us once again and your Board of Trustees would appreciate donations of salt and ice melt for our walkways. Thank you in advance for your donations.



The penitential season of Lent is a season of the Church year which commemorates the forty days Jesus fasted and prayed in the wilderness before he began his public ministry.

Lent is a very personal time, so The United Methodist Church does not have official guidelines on how individuals should observe Lent via a fast or in any other way. Some choose to give up a certain food, however a spirit of fasting can include restriction of luxuries such as television watching, shopping and spending time on the computer. We can give away clothing or possessions to those in need, give our time by volunteering or we can pray more often alone or with family members.





Our 2022 Finance Committee had an extremely taxing year, fraught with concerns and problems, old and new challenges and a forward looking negative financial projection that will require constant close monitoring and the establishment and realization of new norms. In looking back, some of our challenges during 2022, with looks to the future, are delineated herein:

- ❖ Issued a target plan for 2022 with a \$30,000 deficit hoping it would energize savings in expenses, increases in stewardship giving and fuel new ideas for fund raising. Our actual year end figure was a deficit of \$31,930. This will mark our finishing in a negative position 6 of the past 9 years, with the COVID PPP funding we were given, accounting for 2 of the positive position years.
- ❖ This year, 2023, the Finance Committee issued a target plan/budget with a deficit of \$7,500. To achieve this major plan reduction, Finance (1) assessed and estimated all income and expense categories, (2) challenged our membership offerings to increase closer to their 2019 levels, (3) challenged each committee and group to increase their fund raising activities and/or give more money to our general fund and (4) anticipated solar panel electricity savings for the entire year.
- ❖ Illustrated and shared our financial picture, looking into the future with loss positions, which identified various financial sources supporting current church activities which would have to be utilized for current expenses and would thus be zeroed out by around the year 2026. Then, to continue operations as we know them, we would have to go back to families whose loved ones have left bequests to our church for specific reasons and ask them to change the specifics to help sustain church operating activities and to keep our UMCLR doors open.

U P D A T E

- ❖ Realized a financial transition for a new Pastor and a new co-op structure with another United Methodist Church wherein we are sharing specific Pastoral expenses, which will net a **slight positive financial position** for us.
- ❖ Fostered a "deep dive" financial look into the Nursery School, which resides on our property, to ensure its current financial viability and the maintaining of a positive position moving forward. With a concerted effort by the Nursery School, current plans sustain a positive financial position, which will continue to be reviewed.
- Continuously challenged our Church Council leadership to initiate changes in our operating posture to recoup a positive financial position moving forward. Initiated discussions with Stewardship leadership to help decide on a 2023 Stewardship campaign to increase congregational financial awareness and to stimulate increased giving.

Our Finance Committee is a talented, spirited, faithful group of parishioners whose primary focus and concern is our UMCLR financial stability. As Finance leaders, they constantly issue clear, concise, timely and accurate financial accounts and reports along with a dialogue apropos their conclusions, projections and recommendations. Even though the answers aren't always positive, kudos to our entire Finance Committee for a difficult job well done and for spiriting us into the future with fortitude and promise. We all hope and pray you understand our current financials, face the realities and heed our call for help. Thank you.



Lincoln's Prayer for the United States






Candlemas - Ground Hog Day





Candlemas is a Christian holiday commemorating the presentation of Jesus at the Temple in Jerusalem. On Candlemas, many Christians (including some Methodists) bring their candles to their local church, where they are blessed. These candles serve as a symbol of Jesus Christ, who is the Light of the World. Since 1774 Candlemas is always celebrated the earliest on February 2nd and at the latest on February 8th except if this Sunday happens to be the last Sunday before Lent. The custom of blessing candles eventually found its way to Germany. The Germans believed that if the sun appeared on Candlemas, a hedgehog would cast a shadow, making a "second winter", This superstition is the origin for the modern American festival of Groundhog Day, as many of Pennsylvania's early settlers were German.
