

Game Night!


All adults are welcome to join us for Game Night on Friday, January 31st.

Chairperson Soon Bowes opened the meeting with an article from Newsday, "How to Approach Giving to Panhandlers" where Rabbi Marc Gellman shared his thoughts in response to the question represented in the title. Committee members shared their own experiences of helping strangers and also addressed the issue of people pretending to be in need and if you should help those people too. Many viewpoints and perspectives were shared as we were pondering this thought provoking article. An important takeaway is perhaps the vulnerability and humiliation involved for a person to publicly "confess" a need. Rabbi Gellman shares that "we were strangers in the land of Egypt and so we should know the heart of the stranger." Gellman profoundly includes that "maybe, just maybe, that was the Messiah."

Updates and Check in: we are in the process of reviewing allocated funds however, there remains great need in Haiti and Guatemala.

Heifer Project: what a wonderful success...30 goats and 660 chickens donated thanks to the generosity of the congregation and passion put forth by our Sunday School.

Eastern Farmworkers: Over 20 bags of food and 5 huge bags of coats were donated along with 100 toys donated from our Nursery School, 15 toys donated from FunFitness and 60 toys from our congregation were sent to bring joy to the recipients from the Eastern Farmworkers. An additional \$500 was raised through Missions fundraisers and will be sent to the Eastern Farmworkers by the end of the month.

Toys were also sent to a local women's shelter.

* The International Dinner is fast approaching. Save the date: Saturday, January 11^{th} at 5:00. This will be a potluck dinner and tickets will be sold. We will be meeting on Sunday, January 5^{th} after church to discuss the dinner.


