



I know it sounds like a lot of proposed projects, but if we can accomplish one half of them with your financial support and prayers, we can truly say the Trustees had a great 2021. Of course, everything we are planning is subject to the Covid 19 pandemic being quickly and safely eradicated. When that happens, we can get back-hopefully-to a "new normal" that allows us to re-open our church and to become the beacon of light the United Methodist Church of Lake Ronkonkoma has always been to our neighbors and congregation for 225 years.

Your Board of Trustees hopes that everyone who is medically cleared for vaccines should get a flu shot. Not only are you protecting yourself against the influenza virus, but others around you.

December accomplishments include removing and storing the Baker Hall and Office air conditioners and putting out the parking lot markers used in snow removal.

Now, a bit of bad news... Our lawyer, Neil Levinbook, was informed by the Elite Cell Tower attorney, John Coughlin, that Elite is no longer interested in putting a cell tower on our church property. After years of trying to get a response from Elite, they sent us a new contract in late November that was totally unacceptable to our lawyer. He sent the contract back with updates that better protected the church, and that is when Elite said no. The Five Corners cell service area without a tower on our property is still not properly covered. At this point, we believe it best to sit and wait.

The Trustees and the Church Council have both voted to sell the Smith Street property, and to use the proceeds for some of the above-mentioned projects. There are still many bridges to cross before the land can be sold. Please stay informed.

The Trustees would appreciate donations of salt for our walkways during this winter season. Thank you in advance for your donations.


