Please provide an accurate, concise description of the item(s) being pledged. It is hoped that by publishing these items ahead of time that we may lure prospective bidders to our church from all points on the Island.

An approximate value of the item, if known, is optional and will serve as an aid for the auctioneer in determining the opening bid. It will not be published in the catalog. If your donation can be verified to be ever \$100 in value and you would like a receipt for tax purposes, please note in the appropriate box on the form.

You may, if you deem necessary, place a reserve on your donated piece. I must encourage you to exercise this option ONLY when *significant*, personal loss is at risk. A "reserve" is the absolute, rock-bottom, lowest price that you, the donor, will allow an item to be sold. Before exercising this option, just remember that we are trying to sell these items, and that our sacrifices are what drive this auction.

One Room Sunday School starting July 2, 2017 in Baker Hall at 10:00 a.m.


We are looking for volunteers. We need 2 adults for Sunday and Youth as assistants.

#### Society of St. Andrew Gleaning Fields —Feeding the Hungry



#### Preparing the Church and Providing a Caring Christian Presence in the Aftermath of Disaster

Will our church continue to be able to be the church when a disaster strikes? What is in the plan? What are the basics? The UMCLR Disaster Preparation and Response plan being developed seeks to assure that our church and its ministries are able to continue to be the church and help our neighbors in the event of a disaster. The committees that comprise the Church council are currently working on providing inputs to the UMCLR disaster plan.

Below are some of the items that our UMCLR disaster plan seeks to address.

**Emergency Contact list** – Who to contact for help when a problem occurs after normal business hours.

**Utility Shutoff Signs** – to identify location of shut off valves for electric and water should there be a need to shut off utilities due to a broken pipe or other damage.

**Church Inventory Asset list** – Identify all valuable assets for insurance coverage. i.e. stained glass windows, baptismal font, cross, Nettie baker lamp, etc.

**Emergency Evacuation Plan** – Identify and train leaders in the congregation who will be able to lead an evacuation of the church in the event of a fire or other emergency.

**Church Closing** – process for closing the church in case of extreme weather or other event that limits travel or prevents the building from being occupied.

**Building Maintenance Check lists** – to assure that maintenance of key items are up to date and that items like the automatic emergency defibrillator (AED) are ready and operational when needed.

**Hazard Analysis** – Review the church facility to assure that there no hazards that could be a problem to our parishioner's. i.e. problems that could impact an evacuation of the church should an evacuation be needed, use of electric cords or other devices that could lead to overloading an electrical circuit, proper storing of materials, etc.

**Operating to best practices** – Assure that we are providing adequate data back up for all of our computers, have control of computer pass words, and that we have desk manuals for the administrative assistant and the church treasurers functions.

**Congregational Care List** – Developing a list of parishioner's that may need to be checked on when a weather event or other long-term emergency happens that affects normal activities.

**Mission Contacts** – Identify all missions and contacts for each mission. Establish relationships with local police, fire department and other agencies to assure that the community knows of the missions operating here at our church. i.e. food pantry, soup kitchen, thrift store, nursery school, Alcoholics Anonymous, Narcotics Anonymous, and other community meetings that take place in our church.

University in Philadelphia, who, with two other young ladies, has founded a student organization to assist refugees. Temple Refugee Outreach (TRO) was approved as a student organization and seeks to assist refugees adapt to their new home.

Many refugees in the Philadelphia area may have been highly skilled workers in their homeland, but don't know how to pursue that type of employment in this country or how to be a successful employee. Katie will describe how TRO helps refugees navigate the work force of their new home, learn how we do things here and assimilate successfully in the United States. What an ambitious undertaking! This is sure to be an interesting and inspiring meeting.



Our September 11 meeting is a special event, open to all members of the church, men and women, families and friends, to hear an important health seminar by Dr. Mark Castiglione, D.C. He will discuss a program to address fatigue, stress, weight loss and more. Some of you have heard my

testimony of the wonderful changes in my health through Dr. Mark's program and others in our church have had similar results. This is a purely informational seminar, so bring your questions.
