



Shopping in the shop is so much easier on your check book and I am certain you could find something perfect to wear.


Take a chance and come on in because you are always welcome and you never know what you will find!!!



Chancel Choir Season Wrap-up:

I wish to take this opportunity to thank all the faithful, hard-working members of our Chancel Choir for a very enjoyable year of singing the Lord's praises.

Once again, with the goal of enhancing the worship experience for all, you have presented fresh introits and anthems every week with artistry, professionalism, and, above all, passion -- a remarkable achievement. I counted 64 titles presented that you had never heard - let alone sung - before. You sang in English, Spanish, German, Latin, Russian, and Korean. Wow!

In addition to your weekly duties, your special offerings at the holiest of seasons included the exceptionally moving rendition of Joseph Martin's *The Winter Rose*, with chamber orchestra.

On Veteran's Day, you reminded all of the heartache and anguish of war with songs of loss and longing from four major conflicts: the Revolutionary War (*Johnny is Gone for a Soldier*), the Civil War (*Lorena*), World War I (*Keep the Home Fires Burning*), and World War II (*Lili Marlene*)

Your diverse contributions to Black History Month were absolutely thrilling. You hit every emotion with Charles Tindley's hymn *Beams of Heaven*, William Grant Still's touching anthem *All That I Am*, and the rousing spiritual *Hold On!* by Eugene Thamon Simpson.

The powerfully poignant works of Holy Week, challenging in every aspect, proved to be most inspirational. The brass quartet added flair to the *Hosianna* by Bartholomäus Gesius and the *Antiphonal Processional* by Hal Hopson. Anton Arensky's To *Thee We Sing* was perfectly lovely a cappella.

Works by Palestrina, Charles Wood, J.S. Bach, and Dmitri Bortnianski adorned Holy Thursday. With the string quartet's support, our Spanish Renaissance Good Friday offerings by Francisco Guerrero, Melchor Robledo, and Cristóbal de Morales were stunningly beautiful.

We hope everyone enjoyed Choir Recognition Sunday as each member of the ensemble dressed up as his/her favorite confection and sang such sweet music for all: *The Candy Man, How Sweet it is to be Loved by You* (thanks for the tuba bass line, Jeff!), *The Big Rock Candy Mountain*, and *Just a Spoonful of Sugar*.

And through it all, you showed great patience, humor, and dedication. As director, I could not ask for more. My sincere thanks to you all!

"Thank you" does not begin to express my gratitude to Heather Edwards-Wilson, our marvelous keyboard artist. Your prodigious musical virtuosity is matched only by your boundless devotion and enthusiasm.

To Reverend Pak: On occasion, the choir has strayed beyond traditional churchly parameters. Thank you for allowing us the latitude to look beyond the customary for inspiration.

Now I would like to remind the congregation, along with any who love to sing, that our choir is open to all. The only requisite for membership is a willingness to commit time and effort (although the ability to match pitch with your neighbor is certainly desirable). If anyone wishes to "give it a whirl," just show up on Sundays through the summer at 9:30 AM for summer choir. We will sing familiar hymns from the hymnal for each week's service. I hope to see a robust turn-out.

The capacity to give is alive and well within the United Methodist Church of Lake Ronkonkoma. There is a beautiful tapestry of diverse cultures and history that seemingly unites us in making a calling come to fruition. To that end, the Missions, Evangelism & Nurture Committee is excited to share the following updates:

Healing Guatemala Mission Project: Amidst obstacles and setbacks, God's hand (as well as Soon Bowes) moved mountains to get the needed equipment for the continued development of the Dental Lab that will serve the people of Quetzaltenango, Guatemala. While this news is truly exciting, the committee is also reaching out to corporate partners for donations so that the Healing Guatemala Mission Project can continue to grow and develop.

The Mission Walk, chaired by Ileana Czerw was a success and proceeds raised from this walk served the National Kidney Foundation and the National Heart Association.

The Blood Drive was held on May 31st and volunteers donated 16 units to help Long Island. We are looking for a better turnout for the November 17th event also being held in Baker Hall.

The Food Pantry was opened to serve the community on the first Wednesday of each month. Donations will continue to be accepted on each Communion Sunday throughout the year.

Natacha Philogene, along with her husband, passionately spoke during a recent church service about the crucial need for assistance at an orphanage in **Haiti.** The generosity of the congregation led to a donation of \$300.00.

On July 7th, the Missions, Evangelism & Nurture Committee will host the Sunday Service and Speaker Joel from the Eastern Farmworkers Association will join the congregation.
