We are the church at Five Corners spreading the "Light of Christ" from ourselves to the community and the world.









Dear fellow congregants,

Our Church complex has been closed for more than 11 weeks due to the outbreak of the Covid-19 virus.

Pastor Pak, Church Council Chairperson Debra Schild, and your Trustee Co-Chair met on Wednesday, May 27th to discuss all current options and plans for reopening our Church complex. It was decided for the safety of our congregation, to keep all buildings closed to worship, religious, rental, nursery school and soup kitchen activities. The Food Pantry will continue to operate the first Tuesday of each month, and for emergency needs.

This decision was not taken lightly. There is a 26-page "New York Annual Conference Covid-19 Guidelines for Church Reopening" that must be addressed before we can even discuss reopening our facilities. On page 16 of the "Guidelines" we are told that the Pastor, Trustee Chair, and Council Chair are responsible for implementing and guaranteeing that all the Guidelines are complied with not just once, but on a weekly basis. It is not an easy document to read, and in some places to understand, but rest assured, we are doing our best to hasten the day when we can all meet again in person without the fear of infecting each other.

We have directed our custodian to continue "deep cleaning" all buildings so that when we are permitted to reopen, everything will be completely sanitized and disinfected.

To make sure that the areas treated are safe for our reopening, we ask that anybody entering the buildings in our Church Complex inform the Trustees immediately as to where they were so that the areas can be re-sanitized.

In order to save money, all air conditioning has been set at 80 degrees. Please do not lower the temperature.

The Parish Hall (Nursery School building) should be considered off limits to all until further notice. The building has been completely sanitized, and unregulated entry will force us to deep clean again.

During the closure, the floor in Baker Hall has been polished. Fellowship Hall will be polished.

The Trustees must remind all church members that all our rental and Nursery School donations have stopped. Please, if -at all possible- continue to support your Church by donating as much as you can to offset the shortfall, which will be sizeable this year due to the Covid-19 forced closure.


