### **Church Project Launched**

Sunday morning, June 6, 1954, directly after the regular church service, members and friends in the congregation of the Lake Ronkonkoma Methodist Church followed the Rev. Harold Sabin and the chapel choir to the ground outside, where the new sanctuary will be located.

Morris Hawkins, venerable church member, with members of the building committee at his side, led in the excavation ceremony by breaking ground with a new shovel. He spoke briefly on the history of the church. The Rev. Mr. Sabin then led in a prayer, dedicating, and consecrating the ground. The ceremonies were concluded with a dedication hymn and benediction. The church is being relocated on the property, and a 35 by 27-foot extension will be built onto the front. The building will be placed over a new foundation. The useable space will be quadrupled. Work is expected to begin in two weeks.

- 17. How do I spend my spare time?
- 18. Am I proud?
- 19. Do I thank God that I am not as other people, especially as the Pharisees who despised the publican?
