MISS NETTIE BAKER



While Jesus was in the Temple, he watched the rich people dropping their gifts in the collection box. Then a poor widow came by and dropped in two small coins [or "mites"]. "I tell you the truth," Jesus said, "this poor widow has given more than all the rest of them. For they have given a tiny part of their surplus, but she, poor as she is, has given everything she has." Luke 21: 1-4 (NLT)

Sunday, June 9, is "Nettie Baker Sunday." The following is the story of Miss Baker, and her contributions to our church:

Many years ago, Miss Nettie Baker lived on Hawkins Avenue near the railroad station where she kept house for her widowed brother and his daughter. She loved this little church at Five Corners and participated in all the activities. She was a frail woman, but she managed to walk to the church each Sunday unless some church goer took her. As time passed, her brother died, her niece moved away, and Miss Baker was alone. But, her support of her church by her presence and her prayers never wavered. In her last few years she boarded on Ronkonkoma Avenue.

When she died she left her entire estate to the church. It truly was a "widow's mite" (see Luke 21:2 above) amounting to under \$25.00. At that time, the minister of this church, The Rev. Harold Sabin (who was as clever with his hands as he was with the written word) used the money to buy the materials to make the brass light which shines on our present day altar. Rev. Sabin made this brass lamp with his own hands – fashioning it in a little building behind Newton's Garage where Mr. Sumner Newton had made the brass cross which stands on the altar in the Chapel.

In this way, Miss Baker's final gift to the church has become a memorial of beauty which you will never see in any other church. Because there was no family left to remember Miss Baker, the Sunday school at that time filled a wooden cross, made by The Rev. Sabin, with their flowers. That cross was built from the altar rail which had graced the church. Each year a plain wooden cross filled with many holes similar to the one made by Rev. Sabin, is filled with flowers by the Church School children and congregation members. After the church service it is taken to the cemetery and placed on Miss Baker's grave. Just as she remembered her church, so we remember her in this way.

What a beautiful tribute to a woman who would otherwise have been forgotten. She gave all she had to the church she loved, and to the glory of God. This is only one of the many stories of people who have remembered our church in their last will and testament, and left donations for the furtherance of God's will on Earth.

Please remember to bring some flowers on Sunday, June 9 to help remember this remarkable woman and the heritage of our church.



We are again going to prepare buckets to be used after floods. They get stored and are sent to areas that have had devastation. Please bring items to the narthex. We would like to have them completed and sent to Bayport UMC to be stored until needed. July 1st is our target date for delivery.

5 gallon bucket with re-sealable lid

liquid laundry detergent - one 50 ounce or two 25 ounce only liquid household cleaner – 12 to 16 oz. liquid that can be mixed with

water - no spray cleaners

dish soap - 16 to 28 oz. bottle

1 can air freshener – aerosol or pump

1 insect repellant spray – 6 to 14 oz.

1 scrub brush – plastic or wooden handle

18 cleaning wipes – Handi Wipes or reusable wipes, no terry towels – remove from packaging

7 sponges – no cellulose sponges due to mold issues - remove from packaging

5 scouring pads – no stainless steel, Brillo, SOS pads (nothing with soap built in)

50 clothespins

clothesline – one 100 ft. or two 50 ft., cotton or plastic

24 roll of heavy-duty trash bags – 33 to 45 gallon size

5 dust masks

2 pairs kitchen dishwashing gloves – durable enough for multiple uses

1 pair work gloves – cotton with leather palm or all leather

WHAT IS NURSERY SCHOOL?

It was recently asked what the Nursery School is? What do we do? How do they operate? What goes on there?

Well, besides the obvious we teach, guide, and nurture the emotional, physical, and intellectual growth of each child that walks in our doors. We are so much more.

We are a support group for many of the families we have the privilege to work with.

We are the first individuals to perhaps inform a family of speech, or developmental delays. With that responsibility comes a tremendous amount of support from us. We guide our families and help them navigate unknown and sometimes difficult realizations. We work closely with school districts and therapist to ensure the proper care of each of the students we recommend for services. This school year we recommended the evaluations of 14 students. Each of the 14 has qualified for services. We spend hours talking with families to help them with the process. We have attended, called in to, and written reports for 28 CPSE (Committee on Preschool Special Education) meetings this year to aid and support the families in our community with obtaining services for their children. We work alongside agencies to provide the best care for our students in and out of the classroom.

We educate and support parents on an array of different subjects, whether it be toilet training, age appropriate goals, behavior management, personal issues that impact their families, or simply how to support their child's developmental growth beyond the classroom.

We currently aide 5 families in need. Without the big hearts of our committee these children would not be able to attend school.

We hold a pajama drive each year that benefits children in need within our community.

We are so much more than "The Nursery school". We are a staff of 14 smiling faces full of hope and love.

We are a community, a mission, and an outreach. We keep these buildings filled day to day with giggles, laughter, and excitement. We are an extension of the church and we bring to life the Vision Statement of the Church every day by "Spreading the light of Christ from ourselves to the community and the world".

We invite our congregation to contact our Director Phyllis Thomas to schedule a time to visit us. Come see us in action! The children would love to hear a special story from one of our friends at the Church.
