



That is how incredible we are being a lady in today's society. The following is taken from Dr. Bernie Siegel's book, <u>365 Prescriptions for the Soul</u>:

"The Weaker Sex?"

"Women are often called the weaker sex, but there is no question that feminine qualities are survivor qualities. This fact is substantiated by statistics. Greetings from your Board of Trustees!

Fall is here, and it is time for us to prepare for the winter months ahead! Our contracts for leaf and snow removal are in place. The Trustees would greatly appreciate your donation of Ice Melt for our walkways.

We recently signed a binder with the Cotgreave Insurance Agency, located at 588 Portion Road in Ronkonkoma, which updated our insurance. The big change is in wind damage coverage. This binder calls for a \$1000 deductible instead of the 20% required in our old contract.

It is against the law for any civilian to disable our fire alarm. The Church could be fined, and a summons issued for disarming a fire alarm box. In the future, please DO NOT DISABLE THE FIRE ALARM UNDER ANY CURCUMSTANCES. Call the Ronkonkoma Fire Dispatcher (631) 588-8204, and the Securetel Central Monitoring Station at (516) 997-3240. Please read the instructions posted by each fire panel mentioned above. A sealed envelope with important phone numbers will be placed above each fire alarm box. Please open the envelope and follow the instructions in the event of an emergency. Thank you for your cooperation.

Also, as of this date Securetel Central Monitoring will call the phone on the wall outside the library if any fire or burglar alarm goes off in the building when the church office is closed.


