The evening of Friday, September 7th, found Baker Hall filled with hundreds of donated items for our auction waiting to be sorted and tagged. For the very first time, ALL pledged items arrived on site!!! A determined crew made short work of the daunting chore in little more than one hour.

A cold drizzle greeted the set-up team for the 2018 Grand Fall Auction on the morning of September 8th. A host of hard-working folks had the canopies and chairs out quickly. Items for auction were displayed in Hertlin Hall. Fortunately, the weather took a turn for the better and we never saw a drop of rain until near the

close of the event. "JJ's Hotdogs" helped keep the bellies satisfied along with fresh-cooked corn prepared by John Stein & Co.

Prospective bidders came to inspect our array of goods, and many stayed to register and take part. The auction itself went remarkably smoothly. We actioned off 340 items in about 4 hours. There was spirited bidding to the bitter end and all seemed pleased with the offerings and the organization. The crowd was a mix of old friends and handful of newcomers.

I shall not try to name all who turned out to help for fear of omitting someone, but it was a well-coordinated effort with plenty of willing hands. Grateful thanks to all. Your efforts are indispensable to the success of this venture.

As of this writing: hammer price at the podium came to \$3,761.00 from about 50 bidders (that's \$11.06 average per lot -- a very fine showing indeed!); the Make-an-Offer table took in nearly \$100.00; and John Stein's new venture - "Merchants' Alley" - netted over \$400.00 additional.

Most sincere thanks to all who donated such a fine array of unusual and desirable sell-ables. Thanks also goes to everyone who spread the word to friends and neighbors far and wide.

It was an exhausting yet exhilarating day for all involved, workers and guests alike. My congratulations and heartfelt thanks to all. Now start building that pile of great stuff for next year!

UMCLR SUNDAY SCHOOL 2018-2019

Dear Friends/Family of UMCLR:

Welcome back to a new year of Christian faith education here at the Lake Ronkonkoma United Methodist Church! We have had a fun and meaningful summer as we experienced Jesus's parable of the Good Samaritan. We even became Good Samaritans ourselves by making snacks for the coffee hour, creating special cards for our parents and loved-ones, and by helping to collect school supplies for local kids in need for the new school year. Another wonderful year awaits all of the Sunday School children and families and we are excited to kick it off with a Family Picnic on September 9th after service! We hope to see many of you there!

Our children's and youth programs have been solidified over the summer during education committee meetings to better reach all young people each and every Sunday. For our Sunday School, we are once again "diving in" with the Deep Blue Kids curriculum called, "Rotation Stations," where we will begin our Fall semester learning about the story of how God chose Joshua.

Rotation stations are, like the name implies, different stations that will help children deepen their understanding of the Bible story. The seven different stations are: Games, Missions, Spiritual Practices, Cooking, Art, Science, and Storytelling/Drama. All K-5th grade children will be grouped into two or three mixed-age groups to get to know each other better and to experience a different kind of cooperative learning than might be possible in their regular school experience. There will also be a PreK (ages 2-4) class with a special Bible lesson and related hands-on activities each week. The Sunday Youth program (grades 6-12) will meet in the library after the choir anthem every Sunday. Join in the discussion after watching a video clip about everyday life situations and how to respond with a Christian outlook. Youth will use the Submerge guide each week.

We are very excited about the new school year and we hope that you will be excited too! If you would like to get more involved, we welcome you!! Please speak with either Tammy Edwards-Wilson (Sunday School Superintendent) or Alyssa Schoenemann (Education Chairperson).
