



Now summer is almost over, school begins again and the Auction is a few days away. WOW!!


The Thrift Shop is still open and helping our neighbors and church members with a neverending array of clothing, kitchen supplies,

We ask for your continued prayers and guidance in helping provide a loving, nurturing, safe, and fun environment for our students.


